10 The National Maritime Museum (48)
The National Maritime Museum was built in 1656, from a design by the city architect Daniël Stalpaert. The building originally served as a maritime warehouse, in which materials needed for the shipping industry were stored. It has been home to the Dutch National Maritime Museum since 1973. The National Maritime Museum houses one of the most important maritime collections in the world. Here, you can see world-famous atlases and maps among other things.



11 'Huis ten Bosch' Palace (52)
This large country residence is the palace where King Willem-Alexander and his family live. It was built around 1645, from a design by Pieter Post. In 1735, large alterations were carried out on the two side wings, under the direction of Daniël Marot. After the Second World War, the gardens of the palace were completely restored. 'Huis ten Bosch' Palace was renovated from 2015 to 2017.

12 Mars factory (73)
Are you helping the Mars factory run? Take a good look around you and discover the motorway with moving cars, the trains move on by and the boats that sail past.

3 Dutch Parliament buildings (2)
The Binnenhof has been the centre of the Dutch government for centuries. 'Prinsjesdag' (Prince's Day) is celebrated once a year, on the third Tuesday of September, when the King travels from the Noordeinde Palace to the Ridderzaal (the Knight's Hall) in his golden carriage. There he reads a 'Speech from the throne', explaining government policy for the year ahead. The Prime Minister of the Netherlands' office is in 'het torentje' the small tower to the left end at the back.



4 De Efteling (74)
Both the Efteling and Madurodam were founded in 1952, making them two of the oldest theme parks in the Netherlands. In 2017 they existed for 65 years! Various fairy tales are portrayed in the 'Sprookjesbos' (the Enchanted Forest). Did you know that the neck of the fairy-tale character Longneck is 4.8 metres long? Longneck is the story of a prince who, with the help of six servants, finds a princess who has been hidden by the King, and is then allowed to marry her.

5 Hands-on activities: Wind turbines (13)
Wind has been used as a source of energy in the Netherlands for centuries. So it's no surprise that the windmill is one of our country's icons.

6 Rijksmuseum (26)
In this building constructed in 1885 and designed by P.J.H. Cuypers, you will find one of the largest and most important collections of paintings, dating from the 15th to the 19th century. If you look inside through one of the windows you will see

1 XL Tullips
As well as windmills, clogs and the Dutch Lion, the tulip is a typical Dutch symbol.

The Nightwatch (1642), which was painted by the world-famous painter Rembrandt van Rijn.

7 Domtoren (Church Tower) (19)
At 112 metres the Domtoren is the highest church tower in the Netherlands. The only parts of this church that still exist today are the choir, the transept and the tower. In Madurodam, the Dom was opened to the public in 1983, to mark the 600th anniversary of the tower.



8 Sint-Jan (18)
The construction of Sint-Jan began in 1380 but it took 200 years for the church to reach its current size. It is a Gothic church with five arches and it was built from a design by Willem van Kessel. Its double flying buttresses are unique in the Netherlands and the 96 flying buttress figurines are unique worldwide.

9 Anne Frank Museum (23)
The Prinsengracht, is where the Jewish girl Anne Frank and her family went into hiding in a side-building of her father's company. It was an attempt to escape from the persecution of the Jews, in the Second World War. It was
